


HIGH RATES OF TRAUMA OF CHILDREN PROSECUTED AS ADULTS IN OKLAHOMA


Adverse Childhood Experiences or ACEs measure the presence of 10 unique trauma types, including physical and emotional neglect; physical, emotional, and sexual abuse; parental separation, domestic violence, household substance abuse, mental illness, and incarceration. These are the results of an ACEs survey conducted among children tried as adults in Oklahoma. Adverse Childhood Experiences surveys were mailed to 133 individuals incarcerated as adults since childhood in Oklahoma. The responses from the 34 respondents indicate widespread childhood trauma prior to incarceration. The average ACE score among our respondents was 6.27.

TRAFFICKING SCREENING

Six respondents reported being victims of forced criminality, and one respondent reported being a victim of child sex trafficking



ABUSE WHILE INCARCERATED


97.06% were incarcerated alongside adults while **under 18**

23.53% were held with adults in prison, 29.41% were incarcerated in jails, and 41.18% were held in both

67.65% were held in the same cell or unit as adults, and **88.24%** reported Sight and Sound violations

44.12% reported experiencing **abuse** from adults they were incarcerated **with**.

TRAUMA RATES VS GENERAL **POPULATION**



LACK OF SERVICES



50% lost access to necessary health care, or treatment for an active health condition

Only 29.41% received access to services to address any childhood traumas and issues they experienced





85.29% were able to finish their high school education or acquire a GED

70.59% had higher educational resources made available to them



PRIOR SYSTEM INVOLVEMENT/NEGLECT



For those who reported experiencing childhood abuse, the average age of the onset of that abuse was seven years old



35.29% of respondents reported being in foster care or DHS custody at some point in their lives.



26.47% had been hospitalized for mental health care



Many had prior justice system involvement, with the average age of first involvement being 13

ENTERING THE JUSTICE SYSTEM

When coming into the justice system, only 5.88% reported feeling safe

Only 35.29% had an attorney or other adult with them when they were questioned by law enforcement, and only 29.41% were told they could have someone else with them

55.88% reported signing plea deals, but none felt that they understood the terms of those deals at the time and only 2.94% felt it was properly explained to them

Only 38.24% reported being aware of any options for their sentence to be reviewed

SENTENCING

32.35% were sentenced for offenses with mandatory minimums



47.06% were convicted of felony murder



14.71% were given sentences of life without parole



SOLITARY CONFINEMENT

85.29% reported being placed in solitary while under 18, with 50% being placed in solitary for protection from others other than them





Respondents' longest time in solitary averaged more than 6 months









Only 14.71% received a health evaluation after being put in solitary
